Joni Mitchell video

If you are a Joni Mitchell fan, you'll enjoy "Come in From the Cold" (Geffen Home Video videocassette; \$15.95), a 45-minute collection of the folk singer's work. Most of the videos in this compilation (chiefly involving songs from this year's "Night Ride Home" album) are fairly conventional. But "Dancin' Clown" is a delight because it breaks from the acclaimed singer-songwriter's usual introspection and finds her in a playful and disarming mood. In the video, Mitchell dances around the kitchen, sometimes with a favorite kitten, other times strumming a broom as if it were a guitar.

In the mood for educational viewing? This video might satiate your appetite:

"The American Document Series" (1991, Republic, \$19.98 each, 52 minutes each) — The series features 13 cassettes, each focusing on an aspect of American history.
