Look for Tosh to return here

Those who enjoyed the Peter Tosh show at the St. Denis Theatre last week may want to check out another dynamic reggae artist, Ernie Bushé & the Rhythmaestral, who debut locally at the L'Imprevu club Aug. 28 to Sept. 2. Bushé split the Jamaican insurance business 11 years ago, moved to Toronto and is regarded as the premier reggae act in a city loaded with such acts. Reggae fans tend to approve concert promoters. More than 1,000 tickets for Tosh didn't sell until the final day, a normal occurrence for reggae across the continent. But the "Blah" concert was sufficiently impressive during his first Montreal concert to have promoters already talking about bringing him back to a regular slot next year.

Joni Mitchell fans died a fear. The blonde bombshell with terminal angst, now on a North American tour with a stellar live band, has been scheduled to play Montreal. Promoter Alan Summit was hoping to book Mitchell for two nights at the end of August at the U. of M. Sports Centre, but tight broadcast commitments wouldn't allow it. Mitchell's latest, a tribute to the music of the late Charlie Mingus called *Mingus*, is in the top 25 of *Billboard's* 100 and climbing.

The Rainbow Bar & Grill, the continuing but controversial live music haunt on Stanley St. has been sold. New owner Eva Prasad has shut the place for close to \$100,000 worth of ripped-out walls, skylights and a new stage, pending a bigger and brighter bar for its reopening bash Dec. 3. The Rainbow opens to the public on the following night. Admissions, as always, will be free. The Stephen Barry Band is scheduled to play.

Live rock music broadcasts flourished brightly in Montreal in the middle of the decade, but have since withered away.
